Dear Parent/Guardian,

Removal of Content from 2021 End-of-Year Examinations (EYE)

- In view of the disruptions to learning caused by the COVID-19 situation this year, the school will be removing selected content from testing at the upcoming Sec 1 to 3 EYE. For skills-based subjects (e.g. languages and coursework), the EYE pitching will be adjusted accordingly. This is to ensure that our students' well-being is safe-guarded and that learning is not rushed in the lead up to the EYE.
- Our students have been already briefed by their subject teachers about the removal of selected content from the EYE. They will be reminded again at the start of Term 4 as we prepare them for the EYE. The specific content from each subject that will be removed from assessment may be found in the **Annex**, and will also be uploaded onto the school website for easy reference.
- To ensure that our students' subsequent learning is not affected by this adjustment, the school will be implementing a curriculum recovery plan to complete the planned curriculum for 2021. This may include but is not restricted to the following activities:
 - Lessons conducted in the post-EYE period prior to the year-end holiday,
 - HBL lesson packages for students' self-directed learning,
 - Headstart coaching for Sec 3 students during the start of the year-end holiday, and
 - Supplementary lessons at the start of 2022.
